

# Make a Chirpy Chick

1. Taking a strip of coloured paper, wrap it around a small tube, securing it with sellotape. Tuck any overlapping edges inside the tube.
2. Cut out a diamond shape for your chick's beak and then fold it in half to make a triangle.
3. Put glue on the outside of one side of the triangle and stick it to the bottom half of the tube. The other half of the diamond shape (also now a triangle) can be left sticking out so that it looks like your chick's beak is open.
4. Draw two eyes above the beak!
5. Cut one of your strips of tissue paper in half and carefully screw up both pieces - these will be the chick's wings.
6. Put a circle of glue on the side of the tube and stick one of the tissue paper bunches to the tube to make a wing. Repeat this with the second bunch of tissue paper on the other side of the tube.
7. Keeping the other strip of tissue paper whole, gently bunch it up (don't screw this piece up too tightly!) and push it into the top of the tube so that some of it pokes out of the top of the tube. If you've left it as a loose bunch it should stay where you want it, but you can use a little amount of sellotape or glue inside the tube if you wish to hold the tissue paper in place.
8. You now have a chirpy little chick! Perhaps when you get home you might be able to find a little box or some scraps of paper to make a nest for your chick to sit in!
