The wedding party will arrive at Penshurst Place by the private driveway, with its sweeping entrance and spectacular views of the house.

Walking through the grandest of main entrances, the wedding party will then enter the inner courtyard, where pre-reception drinks can be served.

The ceremony and reception would take place in either the Baron's Hall or in the more intimate Sunderland Room, depending on the size of your guest list.

In this uniquely romantic setting, the couple have full access to one of the oldest and most beautiful gardens in England for the wedding photography. The walled Tudor garden is divided into a series of garden 'rooms' by high yew hedges, with stunning vistas back to the house.

The Sunderland Room

Named after Lady Dorothy Sidney, who married the Earl of Sunderland in the 17th century, and from whom the more recent Spencer and Churchill family lines are descended, the Sunderland Room is situated on the upper floor, with access to the Minstrels' Gallery which overlooks the Baron's Hall.

Originally a withdrawing room for the ladies of the house, this part-panelled, part-sandstone walled room, with mullioned windows, a fireplace and views across to the gardens, is also furnished with historic paintings.



A popular choice for ceremonies, it can seat up to 136 guests for the wedding ceremony or 88 for a seated reception.







The Baron's Hall

Built in 1341, this original part of the house is incomparable in its magnificence, and the original chestnut roof is a marvel of medieval architecture.

With its towering beamed roof, original gothic windows and the candelabras lit, this room will delight your guests the moment they enter.

The hall can accommodate up to 200 guests for ceremonies and up to 136 for seated dining.








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Formerly the original bottle store of the medieval household and adjacent to the Baron's Hall, with 17th century tapestries adorning the walls, this




intimate room can be transformed into an inviting bar area for receptions held in the Baron's Hall.
